Since 2005, Aspen Academy has cultivated fertile ground where our students can take root, engage in rigorous academic programs, develop their character and leadership skills, and build a sense of global citizenship through service learning. We believe education should address what students know but equally important, who they are. This means taking the time to know each of our 400 students individually and challenging them to be extraordinary leaders who do extraordinary things.

Over the course of our 2017-2018 school year we welcomed 60 new families into our community; graduated 40 students in the Class of 2018 who continued on to 12 high schools across Denver, and increased our alumni population to 264 alumni at 29 high schools. We launched new learning amenities as we made an investment in iPads for our Lower School, completed our auditorium renovation with improved acoustics that allow our children to be heard and moved the sound booth to the main level to support closer and better access to the stage and coordination for productions.

With our notable dedication to financial literacy, we launched weekly curriculum focus as part of "Money Monday" and "Finance Friday." Our students led countless academic, arts and leadership performances, projects and events and engaged in 7,000 hours of service learning.

The implementation of our Academic Chair program brought the completed research and business case for our Language Arts academic review under the leadership of co-chairs Joanna Weisel and LeighAnn Orsen.

At the end of the year, the following faculty members were elected by their peers to lead curriculum development, create cross-disciplinary connections and model innovative teaching techniques in the following domains:

Gabriella (Polen) Fratta and Corey Sampson, Social Sciences Kerri Esposito and Maureen Mullen, Math LeighAnn Orsen and Joanna Weisel, Language Arts Rob Cooper and Sam Murray, Science.

We took the next steps in evolving our brand to one that more accurately reflects the energy and innovation that takes place at Aspen Academy. These changes spanned from our website and printed materials to physical changes to our lobby. In our West Wing, we completed a refresh with new shelving and paint, MODI chairs and tables. In the Administrative Wing, we completed our interior renovation and exterior painting and replacement soffits. We completed additional outdoor maintainence on the cafeteria.





GRADUATE GIFT

The Class of 2018 Graduate Gift supported the transformation of the Bear's Student Enterprises Broadcast program. With the support of our 8th grade families we were able to:

- Move our audio visual technology from the nest to a central position in the theater, offering our production students the optimal setting to execute clear, crisp sound and lighting.
- Upgrade our audio system equipment with 6 wireless microphone belt pack transmitters and 6 base receivers, 6 wireless headset microphones, 1 rechargeable battery base station, 1 wireless antenna system, and 6 spare wireless headset cables.
- Upgrades to our stage lighting equipment with 1 lighting control console, 4 wireless data systems, 8 full color LED Spot Lights, 6 full color LED Wash Lights


Updates & Milestones

ASPEN ENTREPRENEURIAL INSTITUTE

The Aspen Entrepreneurial Institute (AEI) is the only program in the nation that is a wholly sequenced, year-long curriculum that incorporates economics, personal financial literacy, organizational leadership, and entrepreneurship for Kindergarten - 8th Grade students. Students are exposed to a wide variety of lifelong financial skills that they can take into the world for their personal savings and to contribute to the greater world.

Initial results from AEI curriculum in the classroom show growth (measurements by OMNI), including:

- 63.3% of students in Kindergarten through 5th grade demonstrated proficiency on the post-assessment in comparison to 23.5% at pre-assessment.
- 71.2% of students in 6th through 8th grade demonstrated proficiency on the post-assessment in comparison to 53.2% at pre-assessment.
- Parents consistently indicated that they valued all four of the AEI units as important for their children to learn, and primarily demonstrated support of the curriculum through purchasing products from classroom businesses. Parents reported that they increased the amount they spoke of AEI to others as the year progressed and indicated a decrease in the need for more information about the program to effectively speak to others about AEI.



Milestones:

- 1st Annual Entrepreneurial Expo occurred on January 26, 2018. All grade levels K-8 participated in selling products created from their classroom and grade level businesses. The combined net profit for the expo was over \$2,800 to be used toward future business start-up loans.
- 8th grade Shark Tank took place on Friday, April 13, 2018- winner was Nolan Cooper with his business Promposals.
- Alumni Delaney Ryan (Laney's Lipcare) and Emily Rudnick (RudSpice) made the finals of the Young Americans YouthBiz competition with businesses started at Aspen Academy. Emily Rudnick won her age category.


